CAPITAL PROJECT ORDINANCE NO. 2025-01

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Hertford, North Carolina, that pursuant to section 159-13.2 of the North Carolina General Statutes, the following Capital Project Ordinance is hereby adopted:

Section 1. The Town hereby authorizes the rehabilitation of the Hertford State Theatre ("the Project"), which includes necessary construction, renovation, repairs, improvements, and costs related to phase 1 of the project.

Section 2. The Town is hereby directed to proceed with the grant project within the terms of the board resolution, grant documents, rules, and regulations of the North Carolina State Department of Commerce and the budget contained herein.

Section 3. The following amounts are appropriated for the project revenues:

Rural Downtown Economic Development Grant Proceeds Account No. 42-4610	\$850,000
Total	\$850,000

Section 4. The following amount is appropriated for the project expenses:

Engineering, Design, and Construction Services Account No. 42-5610-562	\$850,000
Total	\$850,000

Section 5. The Finance Officer is hereby directed to maintain within the Capital Project Fund sufficient accounting records to ensure that expenditures do not exceed available revenues.

Section 6. This ordinance may be amended by the Town Council of the Town of Hertford as necessary to reflect changes in project funding or expenditures.

Section 7. This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.
